




Niger-Kongo Sprachen (nach Greenberg, 1963)

Niger-Kordofanian









tumbu- gel	'small calabash'
oto- yel	'small car'
looto- wel	'small washer'

Klasse 21

pad- on	'small shoes'
tumbu- kɔn	'small calabashes'
oto- ɔyɔn	'small cars'
looto- wɔnɔl	'small washers'

Phonologisch bedingte Affixabfolgen

'o yam-d-**it-in-ir-ii** mo
he healthy-DEN-REP-CAU-MOD-past him
'he cured him'

→T-N-R

'o jaɓ-**t-id-ir**-an-ii yam depte
he take-INT-COM-MOD-dative-past I books
'he snatched all my books'

→T-N-R

"This normal order can be summarized by the formula **T-D-N-R**"
