The MS is written in several late Carolingian minuscule bookhands in brown ink. The same group of scribes copied the works of Ivo and Isidore; a similar but distinctive hand appears on fol. 83r-v. The MS

may be the product of a monastic scriptorium. In the *Panormia*, large decorated initials in blue and red open each book. The capitals which open each section of the *Quaestiones* are red or blue lightly decorated in the contrasting color; sometimes green is used. Minor capitals are red, blue, or in ink, occasionally with light decoration or a contrasting wash. Rubrics are red. Fol. 1r-2r and 3v-5r are now largely illegible. Fol. 8a is a leaf tipped in, probably during a rebinding. The note it contains is in a 15th-century cursive hand. Another contemporary hand added 'fuit emptus Cesar[ae] anno domini M<sup>o</sup> iii<sup>o</sup> quadragesimo vii<sup>o</sup> liber iste.' The same hand added running titles; marginal notes are mostly in the two 15th-century hands. Although the quire structure is mixed, quaternions predominate. Quires are marked with roman numerals centered in the lower margin of the first leaf of each quire; they were probably added during rebinding. The MS has a 19th-century leather and parchment binding which incorporates parts of a 17th-century predecessor. Fol. 8a<sup>v</sup> and 56rb-vb are blank.

The MS is written in long lines, in a late Carolingian minuscule, in brown ink. Each book of the *Poenitentiale* opens with a large red initial, sometimes with simple penwork decoration; other initials and rubrics are red. A table of contents precedes each book; the first two are each written in double columns. Fol. 2r-32r have contemporary running titles. Annotations in several early modern hands refer to other canonical collections (cf. Kuttner). The last canon and the final piece are in different hands, the first contemporary with the hand of the main text. <I>r is a title page, of 16th-century origin: 'Paenitentiale Romanum. Tit. I. De homicidio. Index capitulorum'. A folio has been cut away at the end of the last quire. Catchwords are centered along the lower edge of the folio; a few have been cut away. The old binding is parchment reinforced with leather strips. <I>v is blank.

The MS is written in black ink in a single gothic hand, except the indulgences at the end, which are in a different though similar script. At least part of the codex is a palimpsest: erased gothic script can be seen written crosswise in several places (e.g. fol. 46r). An historiated initial 'p' begins the libellus, presumably taking the initial from the 'p' of 'Et primo' opening the preface; the rubric was emended by at least one later hand. Capitals are red with blue decorations until fol. 30. Thereafter capitals are red, rubrics are red throughout. Catchwords, in decorative red and blue frames, are at the lower right. The binding is of leather, from the late 18th-century.

This MS consists of drafts and working notes for materials found in finished form in Vat. lat. 4889, q.v. The MS is not so much an integral work as a dossier, the work of many hands (both copyists and annotators), in black ink and without decoration. The gatherings are extremely irregular. The working drafts of Marsa's letters (fol. 96r, 599ff, and 661r) and those of editorial aids such as the 'leges' and 'ordo' suggest that this collection of materials originated with someone participating in the work at quite a high level, perhaps Marsa himself. (The presence of Patrick O'Hely's letter suggests a source in Alciato's circle.) But there is also a large amount of purely scribal work, like the tediously repeated blocking out of the inscriptions of the correctors. Dates given in the material range from May 1566 (fol. 240v) to August 1578; with the exception of sections at fol. 59r-63v (an C.1. q.2-3) and fol. 685r-689r (on *De poen.*), the contents deal only with the *Distinctiones*. Fol. 1r is a title page, with the shelfmark '5399 p. 1', and the inscription

'Sumpta a Gratiano, ex Burchardi Vormacensis, et Iuonis Carnotensis, atque Anselmi Lucensis, item Deusdedit Cardinalis Decretis. Ex Bibliotheca Ant. Augustini Episcopi Ilerdensis ab eodem pro iuuanda correctione Decreti D. Gratiani transmissa'. On fol. 678r-679r is a rough draft of the minutes of a consistory; cf. Vat. lat. 4913 fol. 76r-v. On fol. 683r is a note on a local festival in Turin, 'de celebratione passionis Ss. Solotoris, Adventoris et Octavii in civitate Taurinensi tertiodecimo calendas februarii ... 12° calendas decembris potissimum recolitur' (a slip of paper pasted in length-wise). Fol. 684r contains a note concerning the *ius patronatus* of a chapel of the Trinci family, dated 1578. Other notes apart from the usual type of editorial material appear on fol. 230v, 236r, 237r-v, 507v, 542r, 568r (on types of indices), 595v, 670v, 677r (a slip pasted in, listing various books and libraries), 680r-684r, 689v-691r. Tables of sources appear on fol. 93ra-95rb and 112r-113va; fol. 231v contains a list of assignments of parts of the *Decretum* to various members of the commission. Catchwords are rare, appearing at the lower right when present. The parchment binding of the MS dates from the last quarter of the 18th-century. The MS can be divided into three parts: (1) the Syriac Didascalia text with translation (to be read

backwards) on fol. 72v-5r, Iv; (2) the translations without the Syriac original on fol. 73r-133r, in a contemporary hand; (3) fol. 2r-4v, a table of contents of a Syriac MS, with which Baumstark shows that the exemplar for this MS might have been Paris, BN syr. 62. The Paris MS may have passed through Lebanon enroute to Florence; in Lebanon it might have been used by the scribe of this MS, who added a note on baptism on fol. 105r: 'Iohannes Baptista de Monte Libano ordinis predicatorum ab ecclesia Romana Dei ueritatem edocutus ...'.

The Syriac text is written in a fluent cursive script, the interlinear Latin in a small, cramped cursive, both probably by the same scribe and both in dark brown ink. It appears to also be by Johannes Baptista de Monte Libano, who definitely wrote fol. 73r-133r. All texts are written in a single narrow column against the binding with almost half the folio free for annotations. There is no color or decoration. Fol. 2-4 are much smaller leaves (282 [265] x 200 [82]) inserted between the last two leaves of the Syriac text. <I>r has the former shelfmark '87' and the note 'Ex libris Francisci Peniae Rotae Romanae decani'. Below the explicit on fol. Iv is the note 'Sedulitate atque iussu reuerendissimi domini domini Francisci nuncupati Penia auditoris Rotae peritissimi e syriaco in latinum sermonem translata est hec didascalia anno Dominicae reparationis millesimo quingentesimo nonagesimo sexto.' For watermarks, cf. Briquet 7629 (similar?) The MS has a late 18th-century parchment over cardboard binding. Fol. 132v and 133v are blank.

The MS is a composite codex. Fol. a<sup>r</sup>-c<sup>r</sup> and 1r-305v are written in a fine Italic cursive in black ink, with initials and rubrics in red. There are occasional marginal notes in several contemporary hands, usually cross-references to Gratian's Decretum. Catchwords are at the lower right. This portion of the MS is a careful copy of Vat. lat. 3829 (q.v.), probably done for the *Correctores Romani*. The scribe omitted the short *nota de sacerdotibus* on fol. 3r, and noted (at fol. 291v-292v here) the break in the text at fol. 267v-268r of his exemplar. Fol. 298v-302r reflect the original order of Vat. lat. 3829, before the penultimate quire of that MS was rearranged.

The unnumbered folios at the end, also in black ink, are in a 16th-century secretarial cursive. Apart from large calligraphic letters dividing the alphabetical sections, there is no decoration. The MS is composite in nature, written in multiple hands (mostly Italic cursive) in brown ink. Initials are in ink, occasionally decorated; they are sometimes missing. e.g. on fol. 412-439. Rubrics and paragraph signs are in ink except on fol. 506-510, where they are red.

Fol. 1-271 are similar in contents and order to Vat. lat. 3477 fol. 1-327 (q.v.) they would appear to derive

from a common source. Vat. lat. 5595 lacks the satirical pieces of Vat. lat. 3477 fol. 142r-146r and 149r. It has only the beginning of the *consilium* by Franciscus Zabarella (fol. 103v) which is complete in Vat. lat. 3477; a scribal note explains, 'Dimisi quia dominus meus reuerendissimus habet ista consilia in libro rubeo'. A *consilium* of Antonius de Butrio which is defective in Vat. lat. 3477 is complete in this MS (fol. 38r-42v). A note at the top of fol. 179r indicates that the exemplar of the Pseudo-Isidore text was defective, 'deficit principium in originale'. The notations at the beginning of the quires in this section of the MS match those in Vat. lat. 3477 although the quires themselves do not correspond as textual units.

Fol. 272-530 contain a second collection of materials related to the Schism. Fol. 333-387 were apparently once a separate unit, the list of *quaestiones* on fol. 333r-334r is keyed to an older foliation system peculiar to this section. Fol. 278 is badly mutilated, retaining only its inner corners with fragments of text (the two fragments are labelled 278a and 278b). Fol. 511-530 are also severely damaged, with only triangles of text in the upper inside corners remaining. The last readable words are on fol. 529v, fol. 530r contains only a tiny scrap pasted to a larger sheet. The quires of this section have markings similar in type to those of the first part of the MS.

In the upper right corner of fol. 1r is the note 'de Castello', suggesting that the MS may have come from Castel Sant' Angelo. At the bottom of fol. 1r are the shelfmark and two scraps of paper pasted into the lower margin containing the notes 'Concilium Pisanum' and *condiciones perplex latis nam stipulationes collate in arbitrium abitas(?)*. Fol. 139r is blank except for the words 'dominus Alfonsus'. Catchwords are centered or at the lower right. Marginal notes appear in several hands. The quire structure is very irregular; quaternions, quinions, and senions are the major types of gatherings. For the watermarks, cf. Briquet nos. 4778, 13874, 2469, 771, 1388, 13883, 7918, and 6443. The MS has a 19th-century parchment binding. Fol. 59r-60v, 98v, 107v-108v, 138v, 139v, 177r-178v, 187v-188v, 253v-255v, 271v, 388r-389v, 411r-v, 440r-v, 444v, 445v-446v, 456v-459v, 480v, 505r-v, and 530v are blank.

The *Collectio Avellana* was written in varying shades of brown ink by two scribes, the first in a late cursive bookhand (fol. 5r-10r, 11r-14v, 208r-256v), the second in a quicker secretarial hand (fol. 15r-208r). The second scribe may also have added the Gregorian letter on fol. 257r-258v; however a different scribe, though contemporary, added the letters on fol. 2r-v and 260r-v. Fol. 259, written in a earlier cursive bookhand, is slightly smaller and was tipped in. All the other pieces were written by an annotator who added extensive marginalia throughout the volume, including notations in space originally left blank on fol. 10v und 14v. The note on fol. 10v identifies itself correctly as a repetition from 'fol. xix', that is the last six lines of fol. 33 of the new enumeration. There is no decoration. The former foliation shows that originally fol. 15 was fol. 1 and that this version of the *Avellana* originally began with Ep. 50. At the top of fol. 1r is the ex libris 'Di Castello' and, in a different hand, the note, 'Dil. filio Macario de Monte Franco scholari Spoletanae dioc. familiari nostro', above which the initial 'M' heads the page. When the volume was rebound, the notations on the former pastedowns were glued to the new guard folios, both in front and at back. Those on <II>r are: 1) a reference to 'folio 80.b.'; 2) a note on Martinus Polonus's *Chronicon*; and 3) a series of Greek words with their Latin equivalents; most of them are medical terms. The notes on <+I>v seem to be a continuation of the informal index on fol. 263v, which they originally faced. For watermarks, cf. Briquet 7629, 6098, and 59. The binding is 19th-century parchment on boards. Fol. 224a-d are blank except for their former folio numbers (211-214); <I>r-v, <II>v, fol. 1v, 3v, 4v, 259v, <+I>r and <+II>r-v are blank.

The main texts of the MS as describing above were written in the first half of the 14th-century in one even southern French cursive hand with red rubrics and initials; fol. 17r (beginning of the Formulary) opens with a blue initial. The same hand filled the free space fol. 9v (after the last appendix to the Provinciale) with a table of the golden number for the easter date. Later hands supplied lists of explicit easter dates for the period 1344-1399 on fol. 16r and for 1436-1530 on fol. 56v-57v. Further additions, annotations and pen proofs from many different hands attest continous use of the MS until the beginning of the 16th-century; see the discussion in Herde I 112f. Folios have been counted in Roman numerals I-LXVI at a very early date, perhaps by the scribe himself; since there is no other foliation at all, this one is followed here using the arabic equivalents. Fol 1, 13, 48, 49 and 66 are cut away. For the irregular quire composition see Herde I 110. There is an unnumbered guard folio in front and a folio glued in on the inside back cover, both of them cut out from a late 13th-century MS containing an Apocalypse commentary (covering Apoc. 1.16-17 and 10.9-11.1); these fragments are from the same MS as those conserved in Vat. lat. 5715. On the upper margin of the front guard folio a 16th-century hand wrote as title of the MS: Memorialia /// pro curia

missing. Fol. 1ra opens with a roughly done multicolored initial. The books of the *Caesaraugustana* are only set off by enlarged, lightly decorated red capitals. Similar capitals open the other tracts and appear irregularly (matching their exemplar) on fol. 132-136. Chapter capitals and rubrics are red throughout. <I>r has a note scratched out and the old title 'Collectio canonum'. The MS has a 17th-century binding of red leather over wood boards.

Space remains for rubrics on fol. 9r-15v. There are marginal notes in various hands, including extensive glosses for the *Concordia* (q.v.) and a single long note on fol. 129v. On fol. 130v a portion of text was erased and replaced. The ex libris 'Liber sancti Columbani de Bobio' appears on fol. 1r and 27r; a third on fol. 17r was written after Bobbio had joined the Congregation of Santa Giustina in 1449 and refers to an inventory of the congregation's books, c. 1453. The MS was given to Pope Paul V in 1618 (cf. Pozzi, p. 13). Quires are marked with roman numerals at the lower edge, sometimes cut away. <I>r contains a list of contents. The MS has a 17th-century binding, red leather over wood, with clasps. <I>r, fol. 8r, and <+I>r-v are blank palimpsests.

The MS is written in Carolingian minuscule by several hands in brown ink. Initials are in red or ink, usually undecorated. Rubrics are in orange display script. Beginning at fol. 55 there is no color except for occasional phrases washed in yellow on fol. 55r-71r. Fol. 1-8 appear to be misbound; fol. 8v is marked 'iiii' in the lower margin, while fol. 38v is marked with 'v'. Many of the leaves are badly worn and difficult to read. The outside edges of the first quire are heavily repaired, with some attempt to save the occasional marginal notes. Fol. 2r has the ex libris 'Liber sancti Colombani de Bobio' and the old shelf mark '57.' In the lower margin of fol. 54v is a modern note 'Hic desiderantur folia licet numerus sequatur'. At the beginning of the *Collectio Thessalonicensis* (fol. 55r), L. Holste has written 'Synodus Romana Bonifatii P.P.II.'. and, in the margin, 'sess. p<sup>a</sup>'. One of the notes to guide the reader of the *Collectio Thessalonicensis* (on fol. 67r) is signed by Annibale Albani (cardinal 1711-51). Other notes are by Angelo Mai (e.g. on fol. 62v and 73v). The MS is ruled in dry point; prickings are sometimes visible. The MS has a 19th-century parchment binding. Fol. 78r is blank except for a *probatio pennae*; fol. 77v and 78v are blank.

The MS is a composite collection in several gothic cursive hands, including that of Johannes de Bellebonis; see fol. 154ra. The ink is brown to fol. 50v and gray thereafter. The MS is heavily annotated, most often by a student of Raphael de Fulgosii, see fol. 37v: 'uy. in libro signato per B. in fi. in quodam consilio domini mei domini Raphaelis Fulgosii doctoris eximii.' The same annotator may have abbreviated the *repetitio* of Johannes de Castillione at fol. 38r-v and added the editorial notes at fol. 37v and 39ra, besides adding the table at fol. 176r-v. The notes on fol. 175v include accounts and a sentence from Jerome's letters. Blank spaces have been left for opening initials. Capitals are red on fol. 1r-18r. Fol. 51r has red rubrics and paragraph signs while the capitals on that page are red with decorations in ink. Catchwords are centered from fol. 22v onward. The codex was written in Capua by the monks of Monte Cassino. The hand often changes with the quire; there are many contemporary interlinear and marginal corrections. Fol. 201 and the three texts added on 327rb-vb are in different but contemporary hands, and an annotator writing in an 11th- or 12th-century minuscule added corrections and additions, apparently from a different version, to the letters of Liberius on fol. 188r-189r. <IV>r has a long note by Lucas Holste (d. 1661), on the contents, lacunae, and errors in the collation of the folios for binding; Holste added similar notes throughout the MS, including a long note at fol. 307 on his conjecture that fol. 307-12 were part of the missing second quire. The Ballerini describe the MS as though the Cresconius fragment were at the beginning of the codex (*De antiqu. coll.* 3.3.1, PL 56.212A). But since the binding bears the arms of Alexander VII (1655-57), it may be that they were simply following Holste's instructions. Below Holste's note on <IV>r is a note dated 1682 by the prefect Schelstrate. In the lower margin of fol. 1r is the note 'Sanctissimo Domino nostro Paulo V D. Constantinus

abbas Caietanus dono do anno Domini 1619 mense Octobris'. Rubrics are orange. Initials vary: some are multicolored (including blue, red, green, yellow, and brown), some have only the outline in ink. Whether the initials are finished or not varies with the changes of hand and the quire structure. Capitals, particularly in the tables, often have a colored wash in the full. Quires are numbered with roman numerals at the end, the first surviving being IIII' at fol. 14v. Prickings are visible on the outer edges. The binding is leather. <I>r has only the shelfmark, <I>v-<III>v and <IV>v-<V>v (the latter a paper insert) are blank.

The MS is a composite; fol. 1-90 and fol. 217-404 were originally separate units. Quire composition and text size vary throughout, with the text size given above being most common. Fol. 1-90 are a direct copy of Vat. lat. 5711, including the three tables for computation of Easter dates (cf. Vat. lat. 5711) and the additions to the Formulary listed in Herde's analysis at I 109f. The copyist omitted the marginalia present in 5711. The texts corresponding to the folios cut out of 5711 are also missing here. This section was written at the end of the 16th or beginning of the 17th-century by a professional copyist in a very neat and even script in brown ink without any decoration. On fol. 1r at the top of the folio is a note 'Formularium iusticiae'; on fol. 90v, in the same hand, is a title: 'Formularium iustitiae 1400 ex uetusto codice Auenionensi, qui nunc adseruatur in Bibliotheca Vaticana.' Fol. 91-216 are written in brown ink in several different and individualistic hands of the second half of the 16th-century; fol. 217-404 are in a single, even cursive in gray-brown ink. There is no color or decoration. Fol. 224-404 were originally foliated as 1-181. Watermarks are illegible, but seem to differ with each section. The MS has a cardboard binding with a parchment spine from the early 20th-century. The work is preceded by the letter of dedication to Antonio Agustín's eldest brother, Jerónimo, of which the autograph is at the Biblioteca Nacional, Madrid, MS 5754 fol. 51v-53v. The text of the work is an autograph from fol. 27r to 157v. Another hand has written fol. 3r-26r and 158r, but in these folios there are quite a few corrections and marginalia from A. Agustín. On fol. 3r a different hand has written on the upper left corner 'Antonii Augustini archiepiscopi Tarragonensis'. This text differs from the edited one in that the *Praetermissa* added by Fulvio Orsini in the first edition (Roma 1583, pp. 321-23) and included without indication in the *Opera omnia* are missing here. Most of the titles and subtitles of the first and second parts of the edited text are also missing. The *De legibus xii tabularum* and the *De senatusconsultis liber* are practically identical to the edited text. There are three former numerations: one for the *epistola dedicatoria*; another for the *Disputatio de legibus*; and a third one for the remainder of the volume. The most recent numeration for the whole MS, written in pencil is followed here. The ink has bled through the page on many folios. Catchwords are at the lower right of the verso of each folio. There is no decoration. The MS was taken apart to reinforce the pages with transparent paper, so neither the watermarks of the paper nor the original quire structure can be determined. The MS is bound in parchment. Fol. 26v, 127v, and 158v are blank.

This MS is composite in structure; the earlier parts (fol. 1r-41v and 44r-64r) were written in an Italian gothic bookhand in gray-brown ink. The other texts were added in cursive hands in gray ink: fol. 42r-43v (a Germanic hand); fol. 66r-134v (several similar hands). In the earlier work (fol. 1r-41v, 44r-64r), initials, rubrics, and paragraph signs are red; catchwords are in the lower left corner, often cut away. On fol. 66r-134r, rubrics and initials are in ink, often decorated in red, fol. 66r opens with two heavily decorated but clumsy large initials. Running titles added by a later hand appear in the upper right corners of fol. 66-82, 94-114, 126-131; catchwords in this section are centered. Marginal notes in several hands occur throughout the MS. The numerous blank folios and the arrangement of the texts, especially in the second half of the MS, indicate that it was meant to be a working manual, with room for additions. On fol. 65r is an inscription for a letter to the abbot of Farfa (probably the beginning of a formula letter); on fol. 65v is a

record of the appointment to the penitentiary tribunal of Genexius de Sp//cis, cleric of Novara, who may have been among the owners (and copyists) of the volume. At fol. 134v appears the note, 'Magister Iacobus de Zabaliis habuit'. Fragments of formulae appear at fol. 134v and 135v. The shelfmark '6290' is written at the bottom of fol. 1r. For the watermarks, cf. Briquet no. 3688. The MS has a leather and parchment binding, partly 17th-century, partly 19th-century in origin. The following folia are blank: fol. The MS is written in gray ink, with no other color, in several late gothic cursive hands. Capitals are sometimes simply decorated; rubrics are in the ink of the text and often crowded into inadequate space. Catchwords are centered, sometimes decorated or framed. The MS has been rearranged in several ways, indicated by three different foliation systems. The oldest foliation, in roman numerals, runs i-ccccxcii, cccxcix (present fol. 37-515, 24-36, 516=499 515=cccclxxix), excluding the table and the pages preceding it. A 15th-century handwritten arabic foliation 1-298 begins with the present fol. 1 and is continuous to 34 (present fol. 36, the present fol. 10-11 being omitted); it resumes with 35-298 on the present fol. 252-515. The modern stamped one in the lower right corner is followed above. The table (fol. 3r-23r) refers to the

roman numerals: entries for i-cccclxxxi in a contemporary hand, and the rest (to cccxcii) in one much later. There are occasional notations, cross-references, and corrections. A few documents have been cancelled, sometimes with the notation that they are duplicates. On Ir are the notes 'Formularium', and 'M. de Guadagnis'; IIR contains the single word 'formularium'. In the upper margin of fol. 1r is the title 'Formularium Urbani 6', in a fine italic cursive hand. On fol. 516v is the note 'Hoc formularium est mei Lazari [Ben. de //] domini nostri pape secretarii ac litterarum apostolicarum scriptoris et abbreviatoris'. Fol. 3, 8, and 91 are damaged. The MS is a product of the papal chancery from the period of its reorganization under Martin V around 1418. It is written in a single gothic cursive hand, mostly in gray-brown ink. Corrections, some marginal notes, and the *resolutiones* in the ordinance of Nicolas III (fol. 27r-30r) are in a contemporary, similar hand. Capitals are in ink, sometimes lightly decorated. Rubrics are also in ink, in a combination of heavy versals and formal gothic bookhand. Although there is no fol. 155, there is no lacuna in the text. There are some marginal notes in several 15th-century humanistic cursive hands. In the first part of the MS (to fol. 145) these are sparse, but in the rest of the MS there are extensive notations in a single, very fine humanist hand, ending in a note on fol. 171r, 'Boetius. Miserrimi ingenii est semper inuentus ut et numquam inueniendis'. The annotator may have been part of Poggio Bracciolini's circle; cf. Herde, *Audientia I* 174. <I>r contains only the shelfmark, <I>v, various erased notes. On <II>r is the note 'Sum Jani et pietas ducit me parcere uictis'. Fol. 172r contains the notes 'de citationibus' and 'Nota quod auditor habet pro quolibet iulio unum Bolognimum.' Fol. 172v-<+I>r contain various notes, perhaps *probationes pennae*. after August 1555, adds the rest in an individual and rather careless hand in dark brown ink with no other  
color for the rubrics; this section has suffered from acid corrosion of the ink. Fol. 1r carries a title in red:  
'Quinternus cancellarie apostolicae cum suo indice amplissimo.' The table on fol. 2-9 is if a hand similar to  
the first. <I>-<V> were added later; <I>r bears the title repeated on fol. 1r in a heavy block script of the late  
16th-century. The same writer entered some notes concerning the origin and juridical value of papal  
reservations by *regulæ cancellariae* on <IV>r; there are references to 16th-century canonists, including

There are some differences in placement of texts, minor variations of rubrics and readings, and the signatures in Barb. lat. 2825 are usually missing here.)

The MS, with the exception of the preceding table, was written by a single scribe in black ink in a florid 16th-century secretarial hand. Most rubrics and marginalia are by the scribe, using a smaller form of the same script. Some rubrics were added by the person who added the table at the front. The latter is in a rough, untrained hand and is keyed to the present foliation of the MS, which appears to be contemporary. There is no decoration. The ink often bleeds through to the point of obscuring the text, especially in the table. Another hand has occasionally added notes cross-referencing documents. Catchwords appear at the far right below the text on each verso. For watermarks, cf. Briquet nos. 12212, 7108, and 12250. The MS has a modern parchment binding. <I>r-v, <III>r-v, <X>r-<XV>v, and fol. 269r-v are blank.

These MSS, which make up Giacomo Grimaldi's five volume transcription of the Pseudo-Marinus formulary, are now bound in 11 parts: Vat. lat. 6364-6367 each in two parts, and 6368 in three parts. At first Grimaldi copied the text from Arch. S. Pietro C.117; when he reached the end of that MS, he turned to Vat. lat. 3976 (see Schillmann 10-14). At the end of each volume Grimaldi carefully noted the dates and circumstances of his work, annotation's partially printed by Schillmann, 15ff.

The five volumes agree in general layout, script, ink, decoration, and binding. All are written in black ink, in the neat secretarial cursive hand of Giacomo Grimaldi. The ink has often penetrated the paper to the point of illegibility. Rubrics, initials, and paragraph signs are red. There are numerous marginal notes, often identifying the original source of a text. Catchwords are at the lower right of the recto and verso of each folio; quires are marked A, B, ... AA, BB, etc. in the lower right corner of the first recto of each. The first folio with writing in each MS carries the shelfmark. A table of rubrics precedes the text of the formulary for each volume. For the watermarks, cf. Briquet no. 7113, but watermarks are difficult to read because of the yellow tissue applied to strengthen the folios. The MSS are bound in 19th-century parchment.

**Vat. lat. 6364**, containing the first part of book I of the formulary, is divided into two parts, I: 1, 1a-x, xm, 2-120; II: 121-283. The text of the formulary is prefaced by Grimaldi's note on the manuscript exemplars (fol. 1f<sup>r</sup>-v) and a biographical sketch of Marinus de Ebolo (fol. 1g<sup>r</sup>-1k<sup>v</sup>); cf. Schillmann 15 and 18. Fol. 1e<sup>r</sup> is a title page: 'Formularium litterarum apostolicarum Marini de Ebolo. Lib. 1 De summa Trinitate et fide catholica.' On fol. 2r a large opening initial an a square ground was drawn but never completed. Fol. 1v, 1a<sup>r</sup>-1d<sup>v</sup>, 1e<sup>v</sup>; xl<sup>r</sup>-xm<sup>v</sup>, and 283v are blank.

**Vat. lat. 6365**, containing the rest of book I, is divided into two parts, I: I-XXXII, 1-120; II: 121-266. The opening initial on fol. 1r, drawn in outline on a square ground, is unfinished. Some initials are lightly decorated. J. Leclercq, 'Textes et manuscrits cisterciens à la bibliothèque Vaticane', *Analecta ordinis cisterciensis* 15 (1959) 79-103 cites this MS fol. 263r-265v, at 95 for a Cistercian *ordinatio negotii*. <XXX>v-<XXXII>v are blank.

**Vat. lat. 6366**, containing books II-IV of the formulary, is divided into two parts, I: I-XXXII, 1-128; II: 129-282. On <XXVI>r-<XXIX>v is a second copy of Grimaldi's biographical sketch of Marinus de Ebolo. The opening initial on fol. 1r is rendered in pen and ink. Tables concerning various administrative matters, in a different hand, appear on fol. 270v-274r, 275r-280r, and 281r. On fol. 274v is a copy of a letter of Paul V to Cardinal Seria (20 mai 1614). <XXX>r-<XXXII>v, fol. 270r, 280v, and 281v-282v are blank.

**Vat. lat. 6367**, containing book V of the formulary, is divided into two parts, I. I-XXXV, 1-136; II: 137-313. The opening initial on fol. 1r is decorated with penwork. On fol. 306v-313r (the chancery ordinance of Nicholas III), initials and paragraph signs alternate red and blue. <I>r is a title page: 'Collectio diuersarum litterarum et formarum ac processuum secundum stylum Romanae curiae magistri Marini de Ebolo canonici Saresberiensis Innocentii papae quarti uicecancellarii liber quintus ex pontificia Vaticana Bibliotheca depromptus anno Domini MDCXVI'. <I>v-<III>v, <XXXV>v, and fol. 313v are blank.

**Vat. lat. 6368** is divided into three parts. I: a-z, aa-ee, 1-128; II: 129-288; III: 289-448. A large opening initial on fol. 1r includes the arms of Paul V and Cardinal Cobelluzzi; another on fol. 368r is decorated with a dove symbolic of the Holy Spirit. In the third part (fol. 289-448) initials are decorated with elaborate but somewhat clumsy penwork. Fol. a<sup>r</sup> is a title page for book VI, mentioning Vat. lat. 3976. Fol. t<sup>r</sup> includes notes on the life and tomb of Nicholas III by Grimaldi, dated 15 July 1615. A long note on Clement IV appears on fol. z-aa<sup>r</sup>, and there is a series of various notes on fol. dd<sup>v</sup>-ee<sup>r</sup>. Extensive marginal notes were added to the tables, as were repeated sketches of a coat of arms (not Cobelluzzi's). On fol. 362r-v is a note by Grimaldi about Cobelluzzi's appointment to the College of Cardinals (*ed.* Schillmann 15-16). Fol. 363r is a title page for book VII. The last few folios are badly faded. book VII was originally foliated separately, but the continuous foliation is followed here. For the watermarks of this volume, cf. Briquet no. 4832. Fol. a<sup>v</sup>-d<sup>v</sup>, fol. 362a<sup>r</sup>-b<sup>v</sup>; 363v, 367r-367e<sup>v</sup>, and 448v are blank.

This is a composite MS. Fol. 1r-256v form a 12th-century parchment MS written in a late Carolingian minuscule in a brown ink which changes to black at fol. 77v. Each of the twelve books opens with a large decorated initial in a Romanesque design, usually a combination of interlace and white vine elements, often with a man or animal worked in. The initial on fol. 6r is an 'T' formed as a bishop. Each decorated initial is followed by a line of display script. Capitals are red, or ink decorated with red. Rubrics are red. Prickings are visible in the outer margins. Fol. 255-256 have been damaged and repaired; fol. 256v is difficult to read. This 12th-century MS was purchased by Antonio Agustín from the estate of Luis Gomez. Agustín collated it with another copy of the collection hold by Niccolò Ormaneto (†1577), now Venice S. Marco Ms lat. IV.55; he then had the missing chapters copied out and bound in as fol. 258r-326v. The 16th-century additions are on paper and written in a secretarial cursive without decoration. Many of the notations throughout the volume are by Agustín; they often refer to Gratian's *Decretum*. Pasted into <I>v is a biographical note on Anselm of Lucca taken from Sigisbertus; it was written by Agustín. Above it is the library note 'In pluteo IX', which has been crossed out. At the top of fol. 1r is the ex libris 'Ludouici Gomez episcopi Sarnensis auditoris rote' and the former shelfmark '466'. At the bottom of the folio is the erroneous note 'Brocardus Vormacen. eps'. which has been cancelled. Above it, readable by ultra-violet, is the ex libris 'Antonii Augustini epi Illerden<sis>' cf. Kuttner, p.19. The MS has two numbering systems, an older one by Agustín at the upper right and a modern stamped one at lower right. The latter is followed here. Some folios are stained. For the watermarks in the paper sections, cf. Briquet nos. 5377 and 5919. The MS was rebound in parchment by the Vatican during the 19th-century. <I>r, fol. 269r-v, 292v, 327r-v, and 336v are blank.

On fol. 3r the scribe notes, against a passage labelled as from *actione quarta santa sinodus*, 'Immo octaua sed sic legit Laborans'. (Gratian's reading, however, matches that of Laborans.) The contents of the MS and their treatment suggest that it was produced in conjunction with the work of the *correctores romani*. Ir is blank except for the shelfmark '6457'. IIv has the pencilled note 'Originale Laborantis, unde haec compilata, extat in archiuo Basilicae S. Petri in Vaticano'. The quires are formed of bifolia gathered in eights. The single watermark is similar to Briquet no. 3395, but has a coat of arms below it. The MS has a 19th-century leather and cloth binding. IIR and fol. 56v are blank except for library stamps. IV and fol. 39a<sup>r-v</sup> are blank.

This collection of 38 volumes was written by Antonio Agustín senior and junior and Francesco Aduarte; cf. Leonardi for a study of the hands. They are in late 16th-century personal cursives in dark ink which have often eaten away the page, rendering the text illegible. The size of the volume given above is the original size of volume one; however, the original quires have been taken apart, and the individual leaves are now glued on modern paper of a larger size. It also does not reflect that many of the leaves are simply backings for long series of notes being rearranged to achieve the final order of the work. In Vat. lat. 6484, fol. 1r has a title by a later hand: 'Antonii Augustini archiep. Tarraconen. Epitome Juris Pontificii Veteris XXXIX uoluminibus cuius epitomis praefationes et praeludia habentur in praesenti Vol. I.' A second title in another hand appears on fol. 1a<sup>r</sup>: 'Praefationes et praeludia ad epitomem Juris Pontificii et de collectoribus canonum D. Ant. Augustini arch. Tarrac. Vol. I.' In Vat. lat. 6484, fol. 1v, 1a<sup>v</sup>, 1c<sup>v</sup>, and 151v are blank. The volumes have mid-19th century parchment bindings.

This codex starts with several printed pages of the Rome 1583 edition: fol. Ir-IVv = p. 1-8 of the ed.; pag. V = p. 97; pag. VI-VIII = p. 100-101, 104. It seems that they were later bound to the rest of the codex, which is written in a very clear and precise 16th-century hand in a brown ink. The first five pages contain a copy of the *Epistola dedicatoria* of Agustín to his brother Jerónimo which is identical to the edition cited. The *De legibus* starts on p. 7, but in an order different from that of the editions. The first part, dedicated to the nature of laws, is missing in the codex. The section on particular laws is quite different from the edited one, not only in the distribution but also in the redaction of the contents. The 'praeternissae' added by Fulvio Orsini to the first edition (Roma 1583) are missing here. The section about the 'Leges XII tabularum' (ed. 96-127) is included in the codex among *de legibus* (p. 47-147) between 'Duilia' and 'Ebutia'. The part called 'De senatusconsultis' on pp. 313-44 is practically identical to the edited text. It seems that this codex contains a copy of one of the first redactions of the work. At the bottom of p. 344 there are, in different hands, the following notes: 'Imprimatur si uidebitur R. P. Magistro Sacri Palatii P. Viceg.', 'Vidi ego Ant. Buccapadulius ex commissione R.P. D. Magistri Sacri Palatii et nihil inueni quod esset contra fidem aut contra bonos mores (///)'. The last line has been cut away during binding. There are catchwords on the lower right side of the folios. The leaves of each quire have an internal numbering system: Ai-vii ... Pi-iii. The watermark is a fleur-de-lis on top of two mountains, the whole within a circle, not like any listing in Briquet or Piccard. The MS has a 19th-century cardboard binding with a leather spine. Pages 6, 311-312, and <I>r-<+III>v are blank.

Through letter 200 the number of the letter is in the margin: by the scribe through 172, added by a later hand thereafter. At the top of fol. 8r, in an early modern hand, is the note: 'Pleraque pars epistolarum que in hoc codice continentur, extant etiam in Formulario Berardi de Neapoli in cod. 3977', q.v. At the top of fol. 10r is the 15th-century ex libris 'Iste liber continet ducentas cartas et est Quatrarri Sulmonensis.' plain after fol. 42r). Rubrics are red and in a different hand; paragraph signs alternate red and blue. There are no catchwords; fol. 1-45 have running heads. The beginning of the *Tractatus* is set off from the preceding text only by its rubric and a large initial. In both the *Summa* and the *Tractatus* are several generations of notes and additions, including many instruments. One hand refers several times to Petrus de Boaterii (cf. fol. 5r, 55v, 62v). On <I>v and <+I>r are two paintings of a pair of lovers. On <I>v the picture was painted over same legal notes; the draft letter on the folio was written around the figures. A fragment of another draft runs lengthwise down the right side of the folio, while another fragment of text (upside down) occupies the bottom of the folio. On <+I>, some dialogue in Italian has been added to the picture, and the man labelled 'Giovanni'. The rest of the folio contains sketches of designs resembling notarial signs, various notes, epigrams, and verses in Latin and Italian, including several on marriage. Several folios have been repaired. The leather binding dates from the last quarter of the 18th century. <I>r and +<I>v are blank.

There are other defects besides the misarrangement of folios. X 1.33.16 is placed between X 1.3.29 and 30; hence the second fragment (fol. 2ra-vb) begins, and the third fragment (fol. 3ra-10vb) ends, in the middle of X 1.33.16. The fourth fragment (fol. 11ra-rb) repeats the preface and the first glosses on the bull *Rex pacificus* (through v. *nimiam similitudinem* = fol. 3rb, line 20), follows these with another partial repetition of the preface ('Set quia ...'), and ends with a short note on contracts. Only a small part of Book three (X 3.1.1-2.5 in med.) is present in the first fragment (fol. 1ra-vb). Finally, X 2.20.35-23.11 are repeated because the fifth fragment (fol. 12ra-84vb) ends at X 2.23.11 and the sixth fragment (fol. 85ra-91rb) begins at X 2.10.35. The text is written in brown ink, in several gothic hands (possible changes are on fol. 12r, 85ra, and 92ra). The MS is written in a professional cursive hand of the late 17th or early 18th-century, in black ink in single columns without color or decoration. The headings in the *Liber diurnus* are in Roman capitals. The *Liber diurnus* text is generally held to derive from an ancient exemplar, *Vat. Arch. XI 19*, and from the early edition of Holste. There are occasional marginal notes by the scribe in the *Liber pro Formosi*; in *Infensor et Defensor* the two voices of the dialogue are marked in the margin. Catchwords appear in the lower right corner of each verso. Fol. 1r and 84r are title pages; fol. 84v contains a biographical note on Auxilius, referring to Baronius's citation of Siegbert of Gembloux. The watermarks are similar to (although later than) Briquet 12250 and 12251. The MS has a plain, green leather binding. Fol. 1v, 83a-c, 106bis<sup>r-v</sup> and 142v are blank.

This is a composite codex. Through fol. 19 it appears to be the work of one scribe, with marginal annotations and corrections in various hands. This section alone is bound in quinions. The leaves have been cropped, perhaps to fit the remainder of the codex. At fol. 20 the gatherings and lay-out of the text change, as several scribes take up the imperfect Roffredus text, fol. 20ra-85vb. More care seems to have been taken with copying these folios than in the previous section. Pecia marks occur only in this section (e.g., fol. 57ra, 64va, 82ra), and the manner in which the text begins and ends - occupying the entire leaf in both cases and ending in the midest of a section - invites the conjecture that there were once more leaves at front and back. Another change of lay-out and scribes occurs after fol. 85.

The ink is brown throughout. Rubrics are red. Capitals and paragraph signs are red or brown through fol. 85, after that, red or blue. There are catchwords at the lower right verso of fol. 9, 27, and 35; the latter two are boxed. At the top of fol. 1r appears 'Odoffredus', or perhaps 'Roffredus', in a late cursive, followed by some undeciphered abbreviations. At the bottom left of the same folio, also in a late cursive hand, is what appears to be 'Roffredus de iure ciuili', reference perhaps to the work found later in the codex. The binding is 19th-century parchment. Fol. 89v is blank.
