The Commentary on the Sentences is in a cursive hand on the erased sheets of a notary's book or court record book; one can see the names Guido Pinaldi and Lamberto Giamboni, and a notation 'pro dote, solui florenos, sub pena', and dates that include month and day. The three folios after 25 (i.e., 25a-c) are ruled in two columns but are blank except for a cursive note on 25v: 'Questiones super materiam sententiarum'. Corrections and variants were added by the scribe himself. Spaces remain for small capitals at the beginning of each article. The text of Bernard of Parma's Casus is in a Gothic hand, with red rubrics and Italianate initials; the folios here are smaller, 204 x 137. The title 'fragm. casus decreti' was added in a much later cursive hand, and was partly clipped off when the folios were trimmed. Compass prickings are visible in the margins from fol. 26 onwards. The verses on fol. 35v are in a faded medieval cursive hand. A different cursive hand added a note after the end of the text on fol. 35rb: 'Cum in iuuentute rex Ungarie denunciauit summo pontifici ...'. Fol. 1r has the number 369 in the upper margin. Only one catchword survives, in a decorated border at the lower right of fol. 10v. The binding is a contemporary parchment one.

The MS is a composite collection that, according Bignami, belonged to Lorenzo Zaccagni (†1712). Fol. 44 is of Germanic origin, but the other texts are of Italian origin. The MS is written in several late Gothic hands in dark brown ink. To fol. 44r capitals and paragraph signs are red, with a red rubric at fol. 31r. The old shelf mark '374' appears at fol. 1r. Fol. 125v has notes on the general councils of Constance, Basel and

Ferrara-Florence. At fol. 126r is written: 'fragmenta iuris canonici et ciuilis'. The first two quires are quinions; the rest, senions. Catchwords are at lower right, except for one which is centered on fol. 173v; to fol. 43v they are framed in red, thereafter, occasionally in ink. Fol. 45 is damaged. For the watermarks, cf. Briquet nos. 11726, 14463, 5747, 4076, 9936, 5153, 3570, and 788. The MS has an old parchment binding, possibly contemporary with the assembling of the collection. Fol. 30v, 101r-102v, 112r-v, 119v-125r, and 201r-v are blank.

The order predicated above is based on the running titles, which generally give the name of the law within the title, and the catchwords. In addition to the text beginning in the middle of the discussion of the rubric, there are lacunae between Dig. 29.2.21 and Dig. 29.2.25 (fol. 354v/363v) and between Dig. 29.2.25 and a more general discussion of Dig. 29.2.35-78 (fol. 292v/366r) which is now incomplete. Because of the obviously missing folios and the blanks left by the scribe, it is difficult to determine exactly what text would be missing. There are large sections of marginalia, often reworking the text, by the scribe. The running titles are composed of 'D. Barbosa' on the left and the name of the law in the title on the right. There is a Vatican library stamp on fol. 289r.)

The MS is a composite of fourteen fragments, some as small as a single leaf. The divisions are generally as noted above. The inks vary from gray-brown to black. Catchwords are at the lower right when they exist. Fol. 289-437 are all in the same late 16th-century rough cursive. The slant of the hand and shade of ink vary constantly, suggesting they were written over a considerable period of time. Blank folios and portions of folios appear irregularly, usually with no explanation. As noted above, they are badly misbound. They appear to be a series of *reportationes*, perhaps coming from lectures given at the University of Coimbra during the period when both Pedro Barbosa and Antonio Vaz Cabaço were lecturing there. Cf. Dolezalek, *Verzeichnis 1*, description of Escorial k.II.2 for such a collection. It is possible that the commentaries on X 2.3 and 3.13 are by the same person; the textual openings are nearly identical. It is also possible that fol. 424 is meant to follow directly after fol. 423, the two commentaries being written as a continuum. On fol. 234r-v are various drafts and notes, including part of a letter to a monastery in the diocese of Urgel. Fol. 374v is covered with numbers and *probationes pennae*, the text covering only the bottom third of the page. Watermarks vary with the fragments. The MS has a parchment binding contemporary with the youngest texts among the fragments. Fol. 387v is blank except for the running title 'De libelli oblatione.' <I>-v-<III>-v, fol. 46v, 49v, 255v, 262r-v, 263v, 264v, 265v, 286v, 293r, 387v, and 438r-v are blank.

Vat. lat. 7213-7217 are written in one clear and even hand by a professional copyist in brown ink. The single 'libri' (years) V-IX gathered in two volumes in the original registers have been separated by the copyist, forming a series of five volumes, the fragment of Liber III added to Reg. Vat. 5 (see Feigl 244 n. 13) being copied in Vat. lat. 7213 fol. 18r-132r (see the introductory note fol. 2r). In the margins are observations from at least two 18th-century hands, including: a) short summaries of the letters; b) occasional corrections of the text; c) complete identifications of decretals (based on the *Liber extra*), and d) occasional indications of biblical or canonical sources of the letters and historical explanations. One of the

annotators seems to have been Domenico Giorgi (1690-1746; see R. Aubert, DHGE 20 [1984] 1450f.), who projected an edition of the Innocentian Registers. These notes left some traces in the apparatus elaborated by La Porte du Theil and reproduced in PL 214 and 215 (see, e.g., PL 214.1027 n. 212 referring to Vat. lat. 7213 fol. 183r).

Vat. lat. 7218 is of slightly smaller size and was written by a different, although contemporary, scribe and may be of different provenance. It contains a carefully organized alphabetical index of recipients of the Innocentian letters, covering not only the parts of the registers transcribed in the preceding volumes, but also *libri I, II, and X-XVI*. This volume still has its original 18th-century binding, whereas Vat. lat. 7213-7217 were rebound in the 19th century.

The MSS are copies of ASV Reg. Vat. 14 and 15. The three volumes are written by the same scribe as the preceding copies of the Innocentian registers. There are no annotations at all. Fragments of former back titles glued in on the first folios respectively indicate that the volumes formed parts XXI, XXII, and XXIII of a previous collection, which may have included Vat. lat. 7213-17. The volumes have 19th-century bindings similar to those of Vat. lat. 7213-7217.

The MS is acephalous, missing at least the outer two leaves of the first quire, which now has only six leaves. If Reynolds is right and it also contained the *Concordia canonum* found in Reg. lat. 1021, q.v., it would also be missing a complete quire in addition to the two leaves. It was written, probably at Salzburg, by several scribes who alternate throughout the MS. It is in a fine Carolingian minuscule with insular traces. The text has been carefully corrected, sometimes extensively, cf. pages 78 und 368. The ink is reddish brown. The running titles are contemporary. Major rubrics, in handsome capitals, are orange or alternating ink and orange when they are more than one line long. Minor rubrics, in the script of the text, are orange. Capitals are usually orange, but those at major divisions are often drawn in ink in rope patterns, sometimes colored with orange and a touch of green. A recent hand has added rough roman numerals on the last verso of each quire. The MS has a late 18th-century leather binding. Pag. 406 is blank with no lacuna resulting.

The codex is written in brown ink in three contemporary Beneventan scripts (fol. 1-97v and 103r in med.-117v; 98r-103r in med.; and 118r-127v). The original scribes made many emendations; a later hand added others, but the text is still very corrupt. Marginal notes can probably be ascribed to the several scholars who used the manuscript in their editions; some are almost certainly by Amaduzzi (see Mommsen xxv-xxviii for a detailed description of the codex and its provenance). The second folio of quire one is missing and with it the last part (c. 15-end) of the table of the *lex romana Burgundionum*; damage to fol. 1 has mutilated the first part of the table. Similarly, because of the loss of the first folio of the fourth quire, only the first rubric remains of the table of Theodosius II's constitutions (the *Novellae* of each emperor are grouped together, each group preceded by its own table), and the first lines of the text itself are missing. The text ends abruptly in the middle of a word in the first sentence of Majorian's seventh constitution; about three-fourths of the folio is blank. Fol. 126-127 are separate sheets stitched together. Headings are written in uncials on a yellow background, capitals have yellow and orange decorations. Fol. 1r has the titles 'Codex Theodosianus' and 'lex romana' in medieval hands, a few jottings (e.g., 'fi. (?) 32 an.5', visible under ultraviolet), and a number of old shelfmarks, some expunged: 'Ag. VI' and the later '327'. both from Queen Christina's library; 'S. The MS was written in varying 15th-century bookhands, with changes of hand occurring with each added text after fol. 460. All are in varying shades of brown ink. Some of the scribes decorate opening capitals, but there is no color. The MS has several folio numerations. The recent system in pencil is followed here. Fol. 1r is a 15th-century title page: 'De concilio Constantiensi/// reformatio ecclesie'. Fol. 1v has a brief note in a 15th-century hand on the contents of the volume. Catchwords are generally centered. For watermarks, cf. Briquet nos. 2776, 6592, 15050, 3868, and 11694. The MS is presently bound in two volumes, both of which have late 19th-century parchment binding. The text manifests the characteristic augmentations and lacunae observed by Fransen in many later manuscripts; otherwise it is complete except for the missing first and last folios. The *ordo synodi* appears after Book III (fol. 63va-64va) in the alternate form found in Vat. lat. 1355, q.v. The *ordo infirmorum* appears after Book XVII (fol. 129vb-130vb) in the alternate form found in Vat. lat. 4880 and 14731. The *admonitio synodalnis* follows Book XIX c. 108 (fol. 163ra-164rb), and, in turn, it is followed by the fragment of an *ordo synodi* as at Vat. lat. 1355 fol. 311v. The *praefatiunculae* appear only irregularly in a shortened form as the rubric preceding the first canon. The marginal inscriptions giving sources of canons are lacking in the second half of Book I and from Book III c. 69 (70) to Book XIII c. 1. The rubrics of canons differ considerably from those of the edition. The text contains numerous errors and unusual orthography. The text on fol. 173v is unfinished, lacking capitals and rubrics.

The MS is written in brown ink in Italian Carolingian minuscule by two scribes who alternate, with changes of hand at fol. 28/29, 52/53, 108/109, and 174/175. The marginal inscriptions are by the scribes. The MS has not been corrected, and there are no notes by later hands. Major textual divisions are marked by large initials, usually in rope designs in varying combinations of red, green, blue, and yellow. The initials at fol. 63vb and 135rb are very simple examples of Romanesque white vine design on a multi-colored background. Chapter capitals and rubrics are orange; both are occasionally lacking. The modern stamped numeration in the lower right corner includes the front and back guard folios. The MS was ruled in dry point, and prickings are visible. There are signs of moisture damage throughout the volume; at times the text is washed away. Fol. 173 is poorly preserved. The non-Vatican binding is green leather over wood

with the ends of the sewing showing through on the spine. Fol. 1r-2v and 174r-175v are blank.

Fol. 154r is blank except for the notation 'folii 212'. Fol. 156v, though ruled, has only an incomplete alphabet. The binding is modern parchment. The MS has the form of a notebook, with the texts entered over a period of time and no consistent form or construction. It is written in dark brown, almost black, ink in multiple hands. The most common is the very irregular and personal cursive of Signolphus de Fynolis. Also present is the round cursive of Georgius Sur., whose work is usually signed or noted as his by Signolphus. Two other, more formal hands, appear at the beginning of the MS. The abundant marginal annotations throughout the volume all belong to Signolphus. There is no color or decoration. <I> and fol. 411 are leaves from a 14th-century missal. Fol. b^r has the short title 'singularis prudentie etc.' by a later hand. Fol. 117r-v have a series of short notes on law and literature, including parts of songs, in at least two hands and entered over a period of time. In the margins of fol. <I> are the ex libris notes: 'Pertineo ad Iohannem Leuss de Traiecto Inferiori ex dono domini Walteri Lollens' and 'Pertineo Iohanni Schurman clerico Monasteriensi pro dono subscripti domini Iohannis Leuss Traiectensis presente Alexandro Rudam.' The original MS is written in a Gothic bookhand in brown ink. One or two quires are missing between fols. 30 and 31, resulting in the loss of the end of title 2.27 through the beginning of title 3.26. The first part of the missing text has been supplied by a somewhat later bookhand in brown ink on fol. 61ra-68vb, continuing from fol. 30vb (ed. fol. 79v). This section ends at fol. 68vb with 'An per inuesturas quas

The MS is written in a Gothic bookhand in dark brown ink. The text was corrected by a second hand. Some corrections are extensive, such as the erasure and rewriting of whole passages. A correction of the text on fol. 9, involving the rewriting of all of fol. 9rb, still left Dig. 39.3.2 missing. A note in the margin leads to the missing text, which appears in the hand of the main scribe at fol. 172v between the end of Dig. 50.15.8 and the beginning of Dig. 50.16.1. Fol. 177rb-178ra are crossed out as repetitious. The glosses are written in a small spiky hand and are sparse through much of the MS. The apparatus on fol. 180-186 is in a different hand. These volumes are formed from the papers gathered preparatory to the Maurist congregation's edition of the Gallic councils, of which only the first volume ever appeared. Written over an extended period of time, the papers are in many hands, with five major hands appearing again and again in the various volumes. They are composed of everything from small scraps of paper with a few lines to quires of folio size containing carefully executed collations of specific councils. Printed pages with annotations appear irregularly throughout the volumes. Some texts are written in French. Virtually every piece is clearly identified both by date of the council and by a note stating where the material was obtained and the date of the MS from which it was taken. After the dissolution of the congregation, the papers were sold by a survivor, dom Michel-Jean-Joseph Brial (cf. Ph. Schmitz, 'Brial [Michel-Jean-Joseph]', *Dictionnaire d'histoire et de géographie ecclésiastique* 10 (1938) 661-62), to Cardinal Joseph Fesch. Subsequently they were obtained by the Vatican Library; cf. Avril and Kuttner. Cardinal Pitra attempted to put them in order but never finished the work. The organization was finally finished by Henrico Carusi and the volumes were bound in their present order at the beginning of the century; cf. Vattasso-Carusi I x-xi and n. 1. The volumes were then individually foliated with a mechanical stamp in the lower right corner. This foliation replaces the earlier pagination on many of the leaves. The volumes can be grouped into three sections. The first,

composing Vat. lat. 9862-9871, is arranged in rough chronological order, with Vat. lat. 9871 (saec. XVI-XVII) actually falling outside this catalogue's focus. Vat. lat. 9872-9874 form a second chronologically ordered set, with more emphasis on indices and auxiliary documents, such as the *Notitia Galliarum*. Vat. lat. 9875 is a 'scrapbook'. It is composed of sheets of blank paper onto which an average of six to eight small scraps, often with only one line of text, have been glued. Throughout the volumes there are multiple blank folios. Often every verso of a given quire is blank. The volumes were bound in parchment and paper in the period 1903-1912.

The main texts and annotations are written in brown ink in the cursive hand of a curialist from the time of Alexander VI; see fol. 7r *marg.*, '... fuimus ego et Ortega ... die x decembris 1495 pontificatus Alexandri pape vi anno 4'. Capitals and paragraph marks alternate red and blue, the former with red or violet penwork decoration irregularly added by a later hand. Rubrics are red, sometimes written by a separate hand. Running titles are composed of 'L' on the verso and the book number on the recto. The lower margins of fol. 3-18 have been cut and/or torn and have recently been repaired. According to Vattasso-Carusi (q.v.), the MS was formerly numbered 10423 and also had a previous binding with the shelfmark 'V SA 5.' The MS has been rebound since the publication of the Vattasso-Carusi catalogue. It now has an early 20th-century quarter-leather and linen binding.

The codex, a companion to Vat. lat. 10270, is written in brown ink, in what is probably a French Gothic hand, and corrected by the scribe. There are very occasional cursive glosses. Book I (fol. 2ra) opens with a red and blue capital with penwork decoration. Books II-IV each open with a similar capital follow by the rest of the first word in capitals alternating red and blue. Book V has the first word in alternating red and blue capitals. Running titles are composed of 'L' on the versos and the book number, in alternating blue and red letters, on the rectos. Rubrics are red; capitals and paragraph signs alternate red and blue, the capitals with violet or red decorations. No charts or illustrations accompany the chapters on consanguinity, etc. (fol. 120rb ff). A medieval hand numbered each column of text; the present foliation, running serially through Vat. lat. 10270, is modern. Fol. 1r has a dated signature by an owner: '1826. Canonicus Vincentius de Lottis' (see Vat. lat. 10270 fol. 344v), and the notation 'Vat. P.1^a', written twice. No catchwords are visible. The parchment, very thin, has been glued to sheets of paper for protection; the ink has bled badly, and some folios are partly illegible. The binding is of 19th-century leather. This codex was written and corrected by the same scribe, and decorated by the same artist, as Vat. lat. 10269; at the bottom of fol. 167r is the note 'Vat. P. 2^a'. As in the latter there are very occasional cursive glosses, there are no catchwords, and the very thin parchment sheets have been glued to paper for protection. The medieval numbering in this MS is for folios rather than columns, it ends with CLXII, renumbered 327, i.e. at the end of the first apparatus. The remaining numbers might have been cut away when the folios were trimmed. The same modern hand that foliated Vat. lat. 10269 did this codex also, serially, so that the first folio here is 167. This numeration goes right through a copy of the article by Mattiauda cited above, which is bound with the codex (fol. 346r-354r). It is separated from the medieval MS by a single sheet, fol. 344, whose verso bears the dated note: '1826. Comprai questo libro dal venditore del tabacco, e dovea perire'; this is in the same hand that signed fol. 1r of Vat. lat. 10269, i.e. that of canon Vincentius de Lottis. The MS is written in Gothic bookhand, in brown inks. The script, by several hands, varies in quality; some parts are quite uneven. Fol. 1r opens with 'Gregorius' in display script. Capitals, rubrics, and paragraph signs are red; the capitals have simple penwork decoration. The books of the *Decretales* are headed by small panels with crude penwork decoration in red. Catchwords are framed at lower right, although most have been cut away. Pricking is occasionally visible. The MS has been corrected in two hands following draft instructions in a large awkward notula by stilus (cf. fol. 17r). The uneven writing and the primitive decoration exclude production of the MS in a professional workshop. There are no glosses, and apparently the MS was never intended to have any. Ir *marg. inf.* has a rough genealogical diagram with the name 'pater Martinus' at the top and other names of four couples descending in two branches. The parchment of fol. 120 has been mended with yarn. At least one folio (probably more) has been cut away after fol. 50 (the resulting lacuna is X 2.2-10 med.-2.7.4 med.), another bifolium has been lost between fol. 73 and 74 (the lacuna is X 2.23.13 in prin.-2.24.16 fin.) Another lacuna occurs between fol. 192vb and 193ra (X 5.35.2 med.-5.39.40 med.) A folio has been cut away between fol. 115 and 116 (the left side of the innermost bifolium of the quire) but there is no lacuna in the text at that point. Fol. 62, 115, and 180 have been mutilated, but with no loss of text. The last folios have been damaged by waterstaining. According to Vattasso-Carusi (q.v.), the former shelfmark of this MS is 10606. The MS has a 19th-century cardboard binding, conserving on the spine the remnants of an older leather one.

Most of the MS is written in dark brown ink in a good humanist cursive by Johannes de Guidonibus de Accumulo (Johannes Accumbulensis); cf. fol. 85v, 511r, and the colophon at fol. 57v printed in Borino, 148. In addition to the thematic legal notes listed above, legal notes by Johannes, but not directly related to preceding works, appear on fol. 101r-v, 101v, 111v, 245r, 254r, and 297v. Portions of the MS not written by Johannes are usually heavily annotated by him, as noted above. He often added other words in the space left blank by the original scribe. In addition to the numerous additions, corrections, and notations of Johannes, there are some marginal corrections, notations, and additions in several later hands. Of particular interest are the annotations in a single 16th- or 17th-century hand noting that a work has been printed and possible alternative authors, cf. fol. 29r and 113r. Fol. 1r opens with a red capital with penwork decoration. Red rubrics and paragraph marks appear on fol. 1-2r, however, the MS is generally undecorated with many opening capitals lacking. Fol. 128r has a note on the 'sacramentum iudeorum' followed by a second note 'Vide per Spec. in titulo de iuramento calupnie restat uidere ...', then a passage in Hebrew with the modern note 'Exod. xx,7.' Vestiges of seals remain at fol. 257-60 and 297. The first eleven folios have both Roman and Arabic numbers; the former are followed here to avoid confusion with the following Arabic numbered folios. The folio numeration skips from 435 to 446 without a lacuna. Catchwords, when they appear, are centered. Fol. 109-11 suffer from acid ink corrosion; fol. 293-296 have water damage. For the watermarks, cf. Briquet nos. 7835, 8349, 2401, and 11702. The MS has a modern quarter-leather non-Vatican binding with the title 'Consultationes Baldi et Bartoli manoscrito' on the spine.

The text breaks off in the midst of Batzer's letter 455 (cf. p. 89). The loss of a folio between pag. 112 and 113 has caused a further loss of text, the lacuna encompassing Epp. 314 in fin. -322 in prin. Many of the letters have been given Batzer's numbers in the margin, e.g. pag. 9. 'Batzer n. 1'. The numeration is continuous beginning at pag. 96 ep. 257.

The main text is written by several scribes in dark brown ink in variations of French *bâtarde* script. Pags. 1 and 9 each have a large red and blue capital with elaborate penwork decoration. The capitals beginning each letter are red with violet or blue with red penwork decoration. Those beginning a new section are more elaborate. The paragraph marks in the table of rubrics alternate red and blue. The rubrics, in red, were added by a different hand, often there is an earlier copy of the rubric by the scribe still visible in the margin. Some letters have the mark 'cor.' in the margin. The MS has two numerations. A contemporary hand numbered the folios of the preface as I-IV and then began the folios of the letters (present pag. 9) with 'prima', followed by foliation in roman numerals centered in the top margin through the rest of the volume. This foliation is then referenced by the same hand in the margins of the table of rubrics. The second numeration is a modern pagination in the upper outside corner, this numeration is followed here. <I>r has an inscription by Paolo Scapaticci donating this MS to Pope Leo XIII: 'Leoni XIII pontifici maximo ... Humillus seruus Paulus Scapaticci ... bibliothecae Vaticanae LL VV scriptor obsequum tibi dedi.' The stamp of Scapaticci's library ('Bibliotheca Pauli Scapaticci') appears on <I>r and pages: 1, 9, and 158. In addition to the loss of the last quire, the MS has suffered extensive damage at the beginning of the eighth quire, where the first leaf is missing (between pages: 112 and 113) and the next two leaves (pages: 113-116) are damaged, with holes in the leaves causing loss of text. The first four folios of each quire have an internal numbering system, 'a 1-4' etc., in the extreme lower outside corner. Catchwords are centered; depending upon the scribe, they are either framed or decorated. The MS has a leather binding with the arms of Leo XIII. <I>v is blank.

The MS is written in brown ink in a late Gothic bookhand, lemmata are black, in large, formal Gothic script. On Iv are two notes, in different hands, on the contents of the MS; most of the folio is taken up with legal notes and quotations from Jerome, *Contra Jovinianum* and *De uirginitate ad Eustochium*, in one of the same hands. Catchwords are centered. There are several foliation systems; the stamped one at lower right is followed here. Fol. 1 and 99 are damaged, and the MS shows some staining at the edges. The color of ink and style of writing varies with the documents. Among the writers are: Verdanus (fol. 30v); Thomas de Salvettis (fol. 45r); Paulus legum doctor (fol. 52v); and Christophanus notarius capitani populi (fol. 115r). Seals and remnants of seals appear, cf. fol. 35v and 56r. There is no decoration. An old written numeration (fol. 28 = old fol. 92) indicates the loss of many leaves. The modern stamped numeration is followed here. On the inside front cover is a tag with the printed number '2801.' The MS is in a generally deteriorated condition. For watermarks, cf. Briquet nos. 6067, 11652, 1243, 11872, and 9969. The MS has a modern parchment non-Vatican binding with the title 'Miscellanea legale'. The main part of the MS is written in several late Carolingian bookhands in brown ink. The opening quire, fol. 2r-13v, is later than the remainder of the text, in a late 12th- or early 13th-century proto-gothic script. Fol. 13vb is compressed, as though the scribe had to complete the text in the given space. This suggests that the original opening quire was damaged or lost and had to be replaced. The book and title initials were never filled in. Capitals and paragraph marks alternate red and blue. According to Dolezalek, the remainder of the Digest can be divided into three sections: fol. 120-133 are 'from the time of Azo'; the remainder of the text is in two alternating hands from the second half of the 12th-century. The MS has three layers of pre-Accursian glosses, some of which appear on attached scraps and on fol. 1r and 142rb-143v. Dolezalek defines these layers as: 1) a gloss of light brown ink added before all the parts were put together, his siglum V; 2) a fine line black gloss, mostly interlinear, his siglum Vy; and 3) the apparatus of Martinus, his siglum Vm. On fol. 14r-30v space remains for initials at the beginnings of books and titles. Beginning on fol. 31r, books open with large, elaborate multi-colored initials in a variety of styles (lacking at fol. 102va and 117va). The names of jurisconsults are written in display script; and titles begin with initials illuminated in Romanesque white-vine design. Some of these initials are inhabited or zoomorphic. Many are missing. Capitals, paragraph marks, and rubrics are red. Catchwords are at lower right. The table, the Bulgarus text, and the papal letter were added in other hands. Fol. 1r has these marks of ownership: 'Aldobrandini Florentie'; 'tempore quo fuit potestas Aldobrandinus de Florentia de ciuitate Assisii currebat anni Domini M cc xiii'; 'Iacobinus de Muç uendidit mi Angelo digestum nouum pro xiii libris et xi solidis turon. (?) presentibus his testibus, scilicet Bonefatio sartore, Nicolao Apoulo, Benuenuto fratre Berardelli et ipso Berardello'. Fol. 142v and 143v also contain additional legal notes and notes on events and on business; e.g. fol. 142v *marg. inf.*, 'M CC xlvi currebat tempore potestatis domini Iohannis Vg. (?) de Greca (?). Many of these notes were written by Angelus de Assisio; see fol. 143v. Most oft fol. 143r is blank, with only a few notes and glosses in the lower margin. The MS, written throughout in gray to black ink, consists of two distinct sections: an integral copy of a minor penitentiary's manual of the mid-15th-century (fol. 1r-86r) and additions made to it at various times down to the last quarter of the 16th-century (fol. 86v-107v). The first section is written in the neat late Gothic bookhand of the Florentine Cistercian Michael Benedicti (cf. his colophon at fol. 86r). Capitals alternate red and blue; two large initials on fol. 1r are in both colors, with elaborate filigree decoration. Capitals in the text are often slashed or filled with yellow or red and yellow. Rubrics are red; paragraph signs alternate red and blue. There are occasional notes and corrections in several hands. Catchwords in this section are centered and lightly decorated.

The second section is written in many hands, mostly cursive and notarial scripts. There is no color except at

fol. 101r-104r, where the opening initial has a simple colored ground, and touches of color were added to capitals and paragraph signs. At two places notarial attestations and signs appear, on fol. 91r (Johannes Marenchus, dioc. Astensis) and on fol. 104v (Johannes Fagot clericus senonensis diocesis); on fol. 88v the attestation of Johannes Antonius de Panigali appears without his sign. Catchwords occur only on fol. 101v-104v of this section, where they are vertical along the inner margin line. The arrangement and variations of the texts closely resemble those of Vat. lat. 6347 fol. 102r-234v, of which this manuscript may be an older relative. Fol. 108r is blank except for the note 'Prioris electio ... 88' and an old foliation number. The modern stamped foliation is followed here; the handwritten foliation skips from 92 to 98 (the modern fol. 108 bears the old number 96, indicating that the original order has been disturbed). The edges of the MS are gilded. On the inside front cover are several labels: 'Tabula seu inuentarium contentorum in hoc libro est in fine' (in a hand contemporary with the later ones in the MS); 'Formularium poenitentiariorum, seu statuta et ordinationes circa officium Poenitentiariae', and 'Codex membraneae, in fol. p^o Ms. saec... In fine addita sunt alia ad eandem rem poenitentiariae pertinentia. Constat foliis scriptis 107'; and 'Dono di Pio X' (20th-century, stamped). The MS has a 20th-century blue leather binding which incorporates part of an old binding with elaborate gold decoration. Fol. 105r-v, and 108v-109v are blank.

The main text is in a late humanistic cursive in black ink. Lemmata are in large dark, uneven letters, the ink of which has often bled through the paper. Many blank spaces have been left for lemmata. The MS was sparsely annotated by the scribe. Five folia have been cut away between fol. 264 and 265 (Sext. 5.12.5-5.13.5). The MS has been restored, the fragments at fol. 304-317 being remnants extracted from a previous binding and mounted on new leaves. Ruysschaert contends that Jacobus Andreae de S. Eugenia, a pupil of Benedictus de Benedictis, was the first owner. The ex libris 'Liber e de messer Micalagelo dato messer Girolamo Lione' appears at fol. 303v. At fol. 307r is stamped, 'Dono di Pio X'. Two notes on contents are pasted inside the front cover. Catchwords are centered. For the watermarks of the main text, cf. Briquet no. 7564. The MS has a mid-20th-century quarter parchment and cloth binding, with remnants of the old binding glued to the inside front cover. Fol. 60v is blank.

The codex is a composite of two manuscripts, the *Summa* and the Constance material. The *Summa* is in a Gothic cursive hand in brown ink, with very occasional scribal corrections. A 17th-century hand added extensive notabilia and corrections, as well as cross-references to the *Liber extra* in an Italic script. The text is in small blocks, as if an apparatus were expected. Rubrics and running titles are red. Space was left at the beginning for a large initial, and there were to be smaller ones for chapters and later books; these are sometimes present in draft. Catchwords are vertical at the right edge of the text. For the watermarks, see Briquet no. 12147.

The table and the fragment of Fillastre, etc., are in different gothic cursive hands, in black ink. The table has flourished initials, and the first words are in display script; folio reference numbers are missing. The acts begin with a very elaborately flourished initial, Fillastre's work with a slightly smaller one; here too first words are in display script. There are no catchwords. For the watermark, cf. Briquet no. 7697. A small slip attached to the inside front cover has a modern note on the codex's contents, the stamp 'Dono di Pio X', and an ownership note of P. Beckx S.J., provost of the Collegium Romanum. A title and former shelfmark are written on the partly restored binding of the back cover by the same hand that annotated many other Vatican codices; see Ruysschaert 152. The binding is parchment over cardboard with remnants of ties. On the spine is the former shelfmark '1259'. Fol. 103v-106v, 114v, and 117v are blank.

The text of the Commentary is in a Gothic cursive hand, in ink ranging from dark brown to black. Rubrics and the first words of chapters are in display script. Barranus became a canon of Carcassone in 1324; see G. Mollat, ed., *Jean XXII. (1316-1334). Lettres communes 5* (Paris 1909) 96 no. 19197. Quire structure is mixed, but quaternions predominate. Catchwords are framed and centered or at the right. The binding is parchment. <I>v is blank.

The MS is written almost entirely in one 16th-century French notarial hand, in brown ink. No color was used. The rubrics and some of the marginal notes are in other contemporary hands; later hands appear in other notes. Some of the marginalia refer to charges (*taxae*) levied by the penitentiary for the preparation of various documents. In some places the text has been heavily corrected, e.g. fol. 38v and 45v. The two letters at the end of the volume are in hands different from those in the rest of the MS. The insides of the MS's cover and fol. 1r-v and 97v-98v are full of various notes and *probationes pennae*. The name Antonius Aurelius appears twice, on the inside front cover and on fol. 98r, and 'Aurelius scriptor penitentiarie' appears twice on fol. 1v. Also on the inside front cover are two library labels and the stamped notation 'Dono di Pio X'. Among the notes on the inside back cover are 'Aurelius', and several repetitions of the phrase 'Vive le roy de France'. The original foliation in the upper right corner is in Roman numerals; the modern stamped foliation at lower right is followed here. For the watermarks, cf. Briquet nos. 7855, 3646, 49, and 13889. The MS retains its original parchment binding.
