1 and 2 had achieved canonical status before WWII, have been banned by the Party until the early sixties. A critical new edition of 1 was undertaken in the 1980s. Other synthetic works by Iorga were also undertaken at that time. 3 and 4 have been influential, but less known outside specialist circles. For the larger educated public, 3 and 4, respectively, have compact counterparts by the same authors. No other works, individual or collective, have ever compared to the first four on the list. During the Communist period, the „Party narrative” – first a Marxist historical vulgate, after the mid-sixties a National Communist one – was anything but a reliable reference, as it was unwriting and rewriting (as Orwell put it), rather than writing history. After 1990, a few (all unsuccessful, some controversial as well) attempts at a synthesis of national history were made, including a revamped multi-volume collective work—ambitiously titled „treatise”—under the aegis of the Romanian Academy. The treatise was severely criticized for its many failures, ranging from plagiarisms to the „cannibalization” of previously published stuff released under censorship and was ultimately forgotten. From among the few Romanians who have tried to offer compact syntheses, Vlad Georgescu (1937-1988) deserves a special mention, especially for the quality of his vision. After „defecting” to the West and ending up at Radio Free Europe, Georgescu published such a work in Romanian. From among the similar, one-author works published after 1989, one deserves recognition (especially for its competent, straightforward coverage of controversial issues): Florin Constantiniu.

Nos 1. and 2. were the main works of the protagonists of two different conceptions of Swedish history, and Fryxell used the term “aristokratfördömandet” (the condemnation of aristocracy) to characterize his opponent Geijer's perspective. No 4., a 40-page article, really a research-program, by Hjärne, initiated the so called “Karl XII-renässansen” (the renaissance for Charles XII), i.e. a renewed, and less critical, view of the king Charles XII. With intermittent flares the debate has continued into our days, regarding how to evaluate Swedish kings, thus being reminiscent of the discussion mentioned above). The medieval, source-critical studies by Weibull, initiated both a debate regarding the strictness of source-criticism, and also an animosity between, two, putatively, “schools”, lingering into the 1950s and 60s. Nos 3. (for lower grades) and 8. (for university level studies) are school- or text-books. Nos. 6. and 9. are - successful - books for a wide, popular audience.
