Academic year

Winter semester: 1 October–31 March, Summer semester: 1 April–
30 September (You can find further important dates <u>on our website</u>)

Application deadlines for inbound exchange students

- Winter semester
 - Erasmus+ Europa: 30 June (nomination requested until 30 May)
 - Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility: 15 June (nomination requested until 15 May)
- Summer semester
 - Erasmus+ Europa: 15 January (nomination requested until 15 December)
 - Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility: 1 December (nomination requested until 1 November)

Registration for modules will be open after successful enrolment at Leipzig University.

Required language skills in language of instruction

Regulations set in the inter-institutional Agreements - predominantly German and/or English, each of minimum proficiency:

- B2 (CEFR) for the language of instruction, especially for Master programmes and doctorates
- B1 (CEFR) minimum acceptable if approved on an individual basis

We offer a three-week preparatory German language and orientation course for our exchange students.

Transcript of Records procedures

The departmental coordinator (see page 2) is the contact person for the Transcript of Records at the end of your exchange stay.



Academic System

According to the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) 1 ECTS credit equals 25-30 study hours (including self-study and contact hours).

Bachelor's degree

- Years of study (full time course load): 3 years (6 semesters)
- Minimum credits per semester: 30 ECTS
- Minimum credits per academic year: 60 ECTS

Master's degree

- Years of study (full time course load): 2 years (4 semesters)
- Minimum credits per semester: 30 ECTS
- Minimum credits per academic year: 60 ECTS

Semester

- Weeks per semester: 26–27 weeks total
- Regular reaching schedule: 15–17 weeks of teaching
- Examination period: 2–3 weeks at the end of each teaching period
- Self-study period / lecture-free time: 6–7 weeks after examination period

Costs

On Leipzig University's website you will find information on the <u>cost of living</u> while studying in Leipzig as well as information on the <u>semester fee</u>. There are no tuition fees. This provides you with a versatile student ID card and the Semester-Deutschlandticket for six months' use of local public transport, among other things.

- Semester fee (due per semester): approx. €270 (varies)
- Fee for student ID card "UniCard" (one-time fee): €10
