W2 Professorship in Molecular Pathology

The successful applicant will be able to represent the field of molecular pathology in teaching, research and service. We are looking for applicants who can offer personal expertise in molecular and experimental pathology. They should have an innovative research profile with a strong scientific orientation documented by outstanding publications in peer-reviewed journals and successful third-party fundraising activities. We expect engagement to develop and establish new scientific and diagnostic techniques at the institute and the Centre for Pathology and Anatomy of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine.

Candidates must be German board-certified specialists for veterinary pathology and/or Diplomate of the European or American College of Veterinary Pathologists (ECVP/ACVP). It is obligatory for the professor and his/her scientific and technical assistants to contribute to the diagnostic service, specialist training, and teaching duties of the institute.

The professor for molecular pathology will officially lead the institute's collaboratively used molecular biological laboratory. Furthermore, an interest in laboratory animal research and qualification as a project leader or deputy project leader for animal experiments according to Section 8 of the German Animal Welfare Act (TierSchG) would be an advantage.

The chair for molecular pathology should contribute to and strengthen the institute's experimentally oriented future research focus. A willingness to cooperate with other scientific organisations within the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine and the wider University is expected. Engagement concerning the strategic research foci of Leipzig University, including Molecular and Cellular Communication in Therapy and Diagnostics as well as Modern Diseases is of particular importance.

The job holder's rights and obligations are regulated by the Saxon Freedom of Higher Education Act (SächsHSFG) and the Saxon Service Regulations for Higher Education Institutions (DAVOHS). Applicants must meet the requirements of Section 58 SächsHSFG.
